



## Graduate Certificate in Global Logistics & Supply Chain Management (GC-LOG)

### 2009 Information & Application

#### Admission Procedures

To be admitted to the GC-LOG program an applicant must have earned a bachelor's degree or its equivalent from a college, university, or technical school of acceptable standing. The student must be currently enrolled at an approved graduate program of a CLI Academic Partner. All application material should be submitted to the academic coordinator at the student home university:

- Application for Admissions Form
- Résumé
- Academic Partner Recommendation Letter
- English proficiency test (IELTS or TOEFL)
- Copy of undergraduate and graduate transcripts
- GRE/GMAT or PAEP scores (Optional)

#### Application Deadlines

Applications for the GC-LOG start on **January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009** and are closed on **April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2009**. Notification of admission will be sent starting February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009 and no later than May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

#### Academic Fees

The GC-LOG program fees are US\$2,000 (two thousand US dollars). This covers all tuition and material expenses during the GC-LOG sessions at CLI (Colombia) and MIT (USA).

Students are responsible to cover travel expenses (airfare, lodging, meals, insurance, visa). For 2009 these costs are approximately US\$1,800 – US\$2,000, excluding airfare. Upon admission, CLI staff will provide detailed information on lodging alternatives. Financial assistance will be available to exceptional candidates upon admission.

#### Standardized Tests

##### International English Language Testing System

IELTS exam measures ability to communicate in English across all four language skills – listening, reading, writing, and speaking. This is the preferred exam for GC-LOG applicants. To register for a test, visit <http://www.ielts.org>.

##### Test of English as a Foreign Language

International students applying for GC-LOG may also take the TOEFL. To register, write directly to: TOEFL, Box 6154, Princeton, NJ 08541-6154, call 1-800-GO-TOEFL (800-46-86335), or visit <http://www.toefl.org/>. Use institute code: 3540 and department code: 99 to submit your scores.

##### GRE/GMAT

The Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test or the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT) are not mandatory to apply to the GC-LOG program.
